

# End of Season report – 2009/10

## Chairman's Report

2009-2010

Our 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary season saw so much exciting table tennis and congratulations to all our league and cup winners and commiserations to those who have missed out.

Since my last report Challoner Table Tennis Club decided to relinquish their responsibility for running the table tennis centre so the latter part of last summer found us heavily involved in some pretty delicate negotiations with Christ's College. Coupled with that we had to establish the standpoint of the ETTA and Sport England (formerly the Sports Council) who provided the finance for the original centre. Sport England's view was basically that a multi purpose sports hall was considered to be a 'gain' so they were content with the outcome and the ETTA was happy assuming that table tennis continued. The financial dynamics have completely changed with us having a much larger area but having to contend with a correspondingly higher rental charge.

With this in mind I obtained a grant from Sport England for £5500 which has enabled us to purchase tables and equipment from Challoner and meet other expenses connected with our open day and leaflet printing. I would like to place on record the Association's gratitude for all the work done by the members of Challoner, over many years, in respect of the table tennis centre.

I would like to thank all members of the Committee for their dedication and passion to ensure the smooth running of the Association, and to Phil Snelson for maintaining the website and to Dave Brown for keeping us in the public eye through his press reports.

As many of you know it is my belief that the future of table tennis is dependent upon young players and I am very grateful to Tony Laws, our Coaching Officer, and his team for running the coaching scheme with undiminished enthusiasm. Their commitment to the game and the Association is huge. It is my sincere wish to see a feeder division becoming established which will allow players of below division four standard, to play competitive table tennis at an appropriate level.

Our heady days of last year when we won the Wilmott Cup came down to earth this year when we failed to retain the trophy. Our lads put in a spirited display as did our girls and ladies in the Carter and Bromfield Trophies. It is good to see us compete at a national level and thanks go again to Tony Laws for his organisation.

Graham Watts seems to run tournaments so seamlessly that one tends to forget how much hard work goes into it. Although entries were down from last year both the Closed and Handicap Tournaments proved to be a great success and I am sure that everyone who participated thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

Last year we introduced a new rule governing the first half cut off time but many matches scheduled to be played in the week specially provided were called off due to heavy snow. Common sense prevailed and I think that our hard working match secretary, Neil Harden, sensed that there was a new air of urgency to get matches played in time.

Last year I wrote about several important issues that have been put before the Committee and the same complaints have again occurred. The service rule has been a bone of contention ever since I first started playing table tennis. We

all know that an umpire is entitled to call a foul service, but we also know that it can create an 'atmosphere' that can spoil an evening. There is no easy solution to this. In next season's handbook we are going to print the rule so that everyone has a point of reference, similarly there has been some confusion with regards to the toss-up at the start of a match and this too will be clarified. As time-outs have become part and parcel of table tennis we are going to permit this in league play and again the rule will be printed. We also keep coming back to the 'spirit of the game' and I would urge everyone to keep this in mind so that our evenings are competitive but remain a friendly experience.

Next year the ETTA will be introducing Player Registrations. The ruling body has a problem in as much as they do not know how many people actually participate in table tennis and they need this information when applying for funding allocations. We will be relying upon all club secretaries to provide the required information. Our Secretary, Dave Brown, will send out instructions in due course but I hope that you will make his work easier by attending to this promptly.

To the outside world our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebrations would appear to have been a huge success. We received excellent coverage and have certainly put the Association on the sporting map, not only in the borough, but to a wider audience. John Diggins worked endlessly and produced, with the assistance of Dave Phelps at Tower Press, an updated version of Ted Simpkins's history of the Association. The new 75<sup>th</sup> book, with many coloured photographs will be treasured for many years to come. We commissioned a special commemorative shirt for just £10, some of which are still available.

Now that the dust has settled, I must say that my feelings overall are tinged with regret because we were unable to motivate enough of the members of the Association to participate in this historical event. After outlying our plans at the AGM, which received 100% approval, we set about putting arrangements into motion. Our first event was a Public Open Day at Christ's College on the 14<sup>th</sup> November 2009. I personally wrote to every club secretary requesting help in delivering specially printed leaflets around Guildford High Street the Saturday before. I received help from just ONE club and that was Bramley. With more people we could really have spread the word to many hundreds of people. The day itself suffered from continuous rain but a third of our clubs did not participate and another third made just a token appearance. I would, however, like to thank the players who did participate with playing and providing refreshments. It was my idea to make this an annual event and expand upon the idea of having a demonstration table in the Friary Centre but clearly there is little appetite from the membership.

Once again a third of the clubs did not participate in the weekend of the 20<sup>th</sup>/21<sup>st</sup> March 2010 at all, another third put in just token appearances which I certainly found disheartening. By the beginning of January it didn't look as if the dinner would even happen but over the next few weeks bookings swarmed in so all was well. The tournament on the Sunday, which was our 'celebration of table tennis', was supported by just over 10% of our membership and there were more guests participating than GTTA members!

There were many brilliant things that happened over the weekend. Despite late withdrawals from Malta and Hungary the team competition was tightly fought with the Guildford team of Matt Pernet, Michael Hills, Richard Tanner, Marc Burman and John Robinson becoming champions. The Wotton House provided a spectacular venue for our dinner with nearly 200 people sitting down. Our guests, The Mayor of Guildford, Councillor Pauline Searle and her husband, Chairman of the ETTA, Alex Murdoch and his wife Val, and President of the Surrey Table Tennis Association, Micky Kercher all thoroughly enjoyed themselves and our 'mystery event', when former European

Champion, John Hilton and his colleague, Brian Keen provided some table tennis comedy was well received. Trevor Free had managed to get all the Association trophies brilliantly displayed and John Diggins provided all the archives for people to recall their past triumphs. James Sellen's pictures were run on a continuous basis in the bar and his tournament photographs and John Fairweather's dinner photographs can be seen on our website. It was an evening full of reminiscences with many people renewing acquaintances after many years. Our President, Jack Harrington organised a splendid raffle, which I regret to say was not supported as well as we had anticipated. There was a lovely atmosphere at the tournament on the Sunday and despite some hangovers the quality of table tennis was very high with Matt Pernet winning an exciting final against an 'on fire', Hari Gehlot.

None of this could have happened without a dedicated team. I chose them carefully and they were simply brilliant. The first of many meetings took place on the 30<sup>th</sup> October 2008 and I think that Trevor Spraggs recorded over 700 e-mails relating to the celebrations. I would therefore like to place on record my thanks to Maria Taylor-Woodward, Tony Morse, Graham Watts, John Diggins, Trevor Spraggs and Jack Harrington whose ideas and enthusiasm knew no bounds.

Looking to the future we have closer ties now with the Sports Development Officer for Guildford and also Active Surrey and we recently participated in the national disability sport programme called Playground to Podium which was held at Charterhouse. This is run by the Mid Surrey School Sport Partnership and they are hoping to obtain funding, and with our assistance, to introduce table tennis to a wider range of schools.

The Surrey Youth Games are held every year and they give young people the opportunity to participate in a wide range of sports. Table tennis has been conspicuous by its absence so we have agreed to organise a tournament as part of these games in 2011 and this has been agreed in principal.

Many of you will be aware that Guildford City Football Club is hoping to have a new ground and stadium at the proposed development at Slyfield. In order to widen their appeal they have invited boxing and table tennis to also declare an interest as neither sport has an impact on bookings at the Spectrum nor the new Sports Park. This is very early days but it is worth keeping our noses to the ground. As more and more regulations come in force with child protection matters I have had discussions with the ETTA and our coaching team about our applying for Clubmark Accreditation. I have quite a bit of experience with the procedure and I feel that this is a benchmark that the coaching scheme should try to attain.

I am willing, if wanted, to continue as your Chairman for a further year (no one should ever outstay their welcome!), but if you wish to vote in someone else with more ability to motivate the membership to support the Association's aims, then I fully understand and will be happy to stand down.
