Entry fees may be paid by cash or cheque. Payments by cash can be made either at the tournament or in person to Chris prior to the tournament. Payments by cheque can be made either by post or at the tournament (made payable to GTTA). All entry fees should be settled prior to your first game.

Please be aware that the above playing schedule is only provisional and may be changed to suit the number of entries. All entrants will receive via phone or email details of their first scheduled match.

Event specific Information

Doubles / Pairs Events: If you wish to enter the doubles or pairs event but have no partner then please enter “Partner required” in the “Partners Name” field of the table.

Handicaps: Handicaps are based on performance within the league. The handicap system used is different to that adopted by the team handicap cup and is the same as Graham has used in previous tournaments.

Singles: Each singles group will consist of three players. The top two players will progress to the main draw, the third placed player will be entered into a plate event so you can't lose, sort of.

Pairs: In the pairs event each match, between two pairs, will consist of three games. Two singles games and a doubles game. The winners of the match progress to the next round and so on.

Etiquette: All players will be expected to assist with umpiring to ensure the smooth running of the tournament. Players arriving late for any event may be scratched from that event at the discretion of the tournament referee, so let me know if you are running late.

Schedule: Players may be expected to play immediately after a previous match has finished. This is particularly relevant to the Handicap Pairs event, so be prepared.

If time allows a Tip/Toe doubles event may also be added to the schedule.

Smoking: Smoking is not permitted anywhere on the school premises.

NB: Due to strict regulations imposed by the School only non marking footwear allowed in the sports hall and no outside footwear allowed in the hall. Only non spill drink bottles to be taken into the hall.
